

Trauma Recovery, EMDR Humanitarian Assistance Programs Student Scholarship Application

Trauma Recovery, EMDR Humanitarian Assistance Programs (Trauma Recovery/HAP) offers low cost basic EMDR training both on-site and virtual online classes for non-profit and public sector agencies.

The *Mission* of Trauma Recovery/HAP is to increase the capacity for effective treatment of psychological trauma in under-served communities.

The *Purpose* of the **Student Scholarship Fund** is to provide scholarships to **current master's level (or higher) students** that are interested in working in Community Mental Health.

Trauma Recovery/HAP will award up to (10) scholarships per application period, in the amount of \$990.00 per award.

Students will receive scholarship funds via a voucher to be used for Trauma Recovery/HAP EMDR Basic Training.

- 1. The scholarship funds will cover the cost of an EMDR Virtual Part I and Part II training.
- 2. Consultation will not be included, and payment will be the responsibility of the student.
- 3. Upon completing the Part I Training, scholarship recipients will receive a questionnaire pertaining to the scholarship process and training to date. Feedback from recipients is vital to improving and continuing the scholarship program. We thank you in advance for your participation.

<u>Eligibility</u>

Qualifying graduate students must be enrolled in a master's or doctoral program in the mental health field (Counseling, Marriage Family Therapy, Psychology, Psychotherapy, Psychiatry, Psychiatric Nursing, Social Work) or related mental health discipline. Students must have completed their core graduate academic coursework and must be in the practicum/internship portion of their graduate program. First year graduate students are not eligible. Graduate students must be on a licensing track and working under the supervision of a fully licensed mental health clinician. During registration for EMDR Part 1 and EMDR Part 2 trainings, students are asked for the name and email address of their supervisor. The supervisor will receive an email request from Trauma Recovery/HAP to approve participation, prior to admission to the training.



Application Deadline

Completed applications including Essay (up to 500 words) will be accepted during the month of **December 2024**. Applications must be e-mailed to <u>scholarships@emdrhap.org</u> no later than **January 3, 2025 (no exceptions)**. This application process will run two times per year, January and July, meaning the next application process will run the month of **June 2025**. Applications must be e-mailed to <u>scholarships@emdrhap.org</u> no later than **July 4, 2025 (no exceptions)**.

Applicants receiving scholarship funds will be notified within 30 days from close of application process.

Please note:

- Scholarships are non-transferable.
- No partial scholarships will be awarded.
- Scholarships cannot be used to reimburse an individual for a training already registered for and/or completed.
